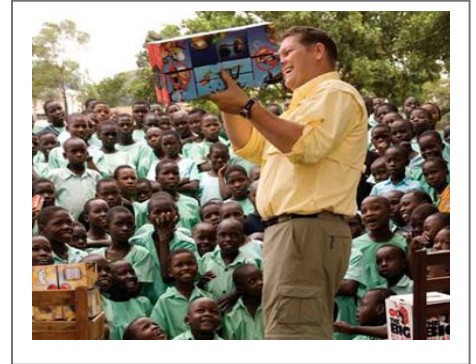


Grace & Obedience Overflow Ministries

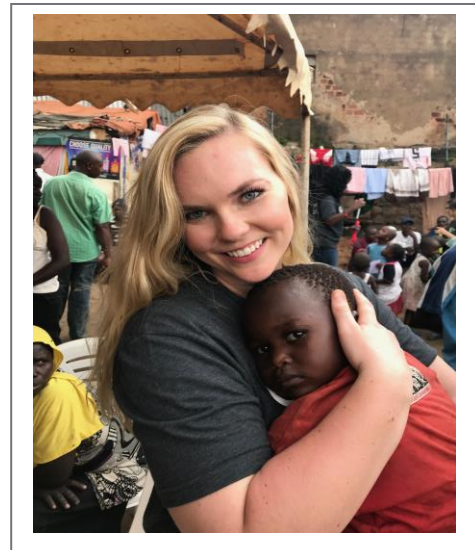
The heart of GO Overflow Ministries is to fulfill the Great Commission as we GO OUT to share the truth of Jesus, and to also fulfill the Great Commandment (to Love) by showing grace to the lost and hurting, as we become the hands and feet of Christ.

Core Values

Restoration: GO Overflow is committed to empower those living in physical and spiritual poverty to restoration through the grace and truth of Jesus Christ.

Discipleship: We promote a Biblical approach to discipleship (how to know and obey God, feed on His word, hear His voice, obey and multiply) and we help equip God's people to go out and share His love boldly.

Transformation: We partner to transform communities through evangelism, discipleship, education, humanitarian aid, medical support, and livelihood projects (holistic ministry). We facilitate opportunities for people to personally *experience* the love of Jesus Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit through life changing mission trips, involvement in long-term child sponsorship, and other forms of community connectivity.



Mission Trips

We believe that a mission trip should be as impactful for the team members who GO OUT as it is for those who we seek to serve. The partnership should not be just for the week or so of the actual mission—a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ for everyone is the ultimate goal! This vision drives the structure of GO Overflow trips, from preparation through continued connection after our return.

All missions will include evangelism and discipleship training, while specific holistic projects may vary. These details will be clearly presented so you can select the mission that you feel God's leading to join.

We also want our trips to be relaxing and fun! There will be opportunities to see the area and experience local culture, and in addition, we will offer optional excursions after the mission is concluded for those who are interested.

Uganda Mission Teams

Primary Mission Locations in Uganda: Kampala and Kabale



Kampala

Kampala is the capital and largest city of Uganda. The city is divided into five boroughs that oversee local planning: Kampala Central Division, Kawempe Division, Makindye Division, Nakawa Division, and Rubaga Division. Surrounding Kampala is the rapidly growing Wakiso District, whose population more than doubled between 2002 and 2014 and now stands at over 2 million.

Kabale

Kabale is located in western Uganda, with a population of 500,000. Known as a “gateway” to Western Uganda and the beauty of Lake Bunyonyi and Bwindi Impenetrable National Forest, Kabale is located 6500 ft. above sea level.

Temperatures average at around 70 F, with evenings dipping in the low 50's. The town offers industry, restaurants, and internet cafes, but still has a more rural and "village" feel overall. Several breathtaking hotels offer spectacular views of the lake and mountainous region.



What is a typical day on a GO Overflow Mission Trip?

While each mission is unique, and we can also tailor-make a trip for a specific group, there are some aspects of each mission experience that are replicated. During our 11-14 day missions, you can expect to participate in the following:

- Morning devotions led by Team leaders/team members
- Door to door evangelism within local villages, in partnership with churches (you will be trained, and will participate as you are comfortable)
- Worship and small group discussion (discipleship) at local churches
- Assisting at local GO Overflow livelihood projects (chicken coops, sewing, etc.)
- Minor construction projects (painting, basic building, cleaning)
- Working at our partner pregnancy/medical center (roles assigned based on expertise, more involvement in this location for "medical focus" teams)
- Teaching and games with children at partner schools
- Feeding children in the slums of Kampala, medical support of slum children/teens. Work with young ladies in the slums who are in prostitution/pregnant.
- Activity/excursion in the local community (white water rafting, mini safari, etc.)

Other optional activities during the mission include assisting at local malnutrition/medical clinics in rural villages, additional work with slum children (sports activities, etc.), and meeting specific needs that are presented by partner ministries.



Who does GO Overflow work with in country?

Partnerships with local ministries is a key component of GO Overflow; we work with churches and non-profits within the local communities who are already actively helping those in need. GO Overflow offers year-round support to our partners, through business partnerships, project-focused finances, child sponsorships, and visiting mission teams. We help to further the ongoing work that is happening, broadening the reach and scope of those ministering daily in local communities.





Where do mission teams stay? What are the costs?

Our mission teams to Uganda will typically stay in various hotels, specifics details will be shared for your particular trip. These reliable, safe and secure properties provide electricity, hot

Costs for a team vary somewhat based on length, time of year (airline costs), and specific details of the overall itinerary. Per person prices typically include airfare, hotel, food, local transport, travel insurance, ministry supply expenses, and other incidentals. Details of out of pocket expenses are clearly outlined and are minimal. An average 11-day mission (seven days on ground in country) ranges from \$3500-\$4200 per person.

How do I sign up for a trip?

You can fill out a trip application form for a particular mission on our website under the “Get Involved” tab or email us at info@go-overflow.org. We are happy to answer any questions you might have, and if you are ready to commit to a mission, we’ll let you know next steps. A \$200 non-refundable deposit is due 90 days prior to the departure of the mission, and an additional \$2000 (for Uganda missions) is due 45 days prior to departure. We will secure airline reservations at this time.
